1. FOREWORD

Pre-university Education Schools Tournament 2024 will be organized in the city Tula from 22-30 June 2024.

3.2. AGE LIMIT

There is absolutely no discrimination against sex, religion, races or political origins. Participation of women is strongly encouraged.

All competitors must satisfy the following conditions:

> Be a national of the country they represent

> for Track and field, Swimming, Volleyball, Air gun shooting

Age limit 15-17 in 2024 (throughout the year) - students born from 01.01.2007 till 31.12.2009 will be allowed to participate in the Pre-university Education Schools Tournament 2024.









> for Boxing

Age limit 16-17 in 2024 (throughout the year) - students born from 01.01.2007 till 31.12.2008 will be allowed to participate in the Pre-university Education Schools Tournament 2024.

4. COMPOSITION OF A MISSION

Teams sent by their nations to participate in the Tournament are called "Mission". Any mission can participate in all sport or some of them.

The composition of the mission is therefore directly linked to the choice of sport in which the mission will participate. The following table lists the different members of mission per sport and represents the maximal composition of a mission.

Delegations are required to strictly respect the standard composition of a participating mission.

Organizing Committee has no financial or organizational obligation toward people who are not included in the mission (relatives, spectators, etc.) No additional member may be included in the mission without special authorization from the Organizing Country. In all cases where the composition is not respected, mission must pay the extra lodging cost

For any doubt and/or clarification, please contact the Organizing Committee. **NOTE:**

All other people, such as spectators, relatives, friends, etc. are welcome to the Tournament and can obtain entrance ticket to the ceremonies and to the sport events. They have to organize themselves their board, lodging and local transportation.









5. **PARTICIPANTS STATUS**

Every CISM Delegation, in active status has the right to participate in the Preuniversity Education Schools Tournament 2024. The up-to-date list of active/inactive CISM Member Nation may be obtained upon request to the CISM General Secretariat.

During the Tournament, all participating athletes must be students of respective Pre-university Education Schools.

By signing the Final Entry, the Chief of Delegation confirms status of the participating athletes. If there are last minute changes in the participation of the athletes, the verification file may be signed by the Chief of Mission, but shall be confirmed by the CoD by official letter.

6. VISAS

To be allowed on the Russian territory, any foreigner shall possess one valid passport (still valid 6 months after their return to their country) and shall present a travel document accepted by the Russian authorities, one visa (for the countries falling under that bond) as well as the justifications related to their conditions and durations of stay.

It is highly recommended that each participating nation contacts the embassy of the Russian Federation in their respective country for specific information regarding to entry procedures and VISA information into the Russia. Failure to do so may cause some problems with entry into the Russian Federation.

Delegations of countries that require a visa to enter the Russian Federation must complete «Final Entry - Personal data for accreditation and visas support to visit the Russian Federation». And send to Organizing Committee with color scanned copies of the first page of the valid passports of all members of the delegation in full size and in good quality before 22 April 2024.

7. CUSTOMS PROCEDURES

Without declaring, it is allowed to import currency in an amount not exceeding the equivalent of \$10,000 (the total amount of cash and traveller's checks).

Monetary instruments (bills of exchange, bank checks, bearer securities) are subject to mandatory declaration, regardless of the amount.

The import of cash and traveller's checks in excess of the equivalent of \$10,000 is subject to mandatory declaration.

Money on a bank card does not need to be declared.

8. CURRENCY

The local currency is the Russian Ruble.

Due to restrictions, payments by credit cards of foreign banks (VISA and Mastercard) are not currently available.

The payments can be made only in cash (in Russian rubles).

The Organizing Committee will assist in the exchange of cash foreign currency for Russian rubles.

In case of a change in the situation regarding the method of payment, the Organizing Committee will immediately inform the delegations of the participating countries.









9. BOARD AND LODGING 9.1 CATEGORIES CONSIDERED FOR LODGING

The Organizing Committee commit itself to accommodate in full board and lodging any official registered participant in the Pre-university Education Schools Tournament 2024. This accommodation will respect the following table:

9.2 MEALS AND DRINKS

Meals and drinks will both be balanced and substantial and meet the requirement of sport dietetics. As much as possible, the following points will be taken into consideration:

- Traditions particular to race and religion;
- Medical requirements and prescriptions;
- Schedule of events;







- The Organizing Committee will provide free of charge non alcoholic drinks during meals and water throughout the duration of the competitions.

9.3 EXTRA EXPENSES

Extra expenses including telephone, laundry and drinks must be paid by the consumers. Any cost before the foreseen arrival and/or the departure date, must be covered by the participants.

10. ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

10.1 GENERAL

Missions should arrive at airports or railway stations <u>in Moscow on 22 - 23</u> June 2024.

Transportation on the route Moscow - Tula and Tula - Moscow will be carried out by the transport of the Organizing Committee.

Missions are required to strictly comply with the scheduled arrival and departing dates fixed in the General Schedule of Events.

If your mission is arriving split on various groups, please specify the different flights.

10.2 EARLY ARRIVAL AND LATE DEPARTURE

Missions arriving before 22 June and departing after 30 June 2024 will be responsible for all expenses incurred in the period out of competition.

Members of the CISM General Secretariat, Official CISM Representatives, Presidents and members of CISM Sport Committees are authorized to arrive on June 20, 2024.

In all cases, missions leaving after the fixed date must pay extra accommodation costs. For any doubt and/or clarification, please contact the Organizing Committee.

If the missions need for extending because the problem of flight schedule, please inform at the Final Entry Form.

11. TRANSPORTATION AND TRAVEL EXPENSES

As a general rule, travelling expenses of participating authorities and missions to the venue of the Pre-university Education Schools Tournament 2024 are borne by the delegations they belong to. Local transportation is mandatory from all the accommodation sites to all the sports competition and official venues; these costs will be borne by the Organizing Committee.

Organizing Committee will prepare a transportation plan for the Preuniversity Education Schools Tournament 2024 period taking into consideration the following points:

a) Individual cars: with drivers will be provided by Organizing Committee for each of the following number of authorities:

- > CISM President
- > CISM Vice-Presidents
- > Official CISM Representatives OCRs
- > CISM Secretary General
- > CISM Games Department Director
- > PCSCs

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> Chiefs of Mission (for moving to the competition venues, during the competition period)

b) A special shuttle service: to transport the CISM BoD Members, CISM HQ Staff, CSC Members, from their hotels to the sports venues and vice-versa;

c) Shuttle service: to transport the participants:

> From the Moscow International Airports (Sheremetyevo, Domodedovo, Vnukovo, Zhukovsky), Moscow railway stations to the accommodation site(s) and vice-versa.

> From the accommodation site(s) to the sports venues and vice-versa.

d) The Organizing Committee: will ensure that the drivers are suitably trained as such and that they have a satisfactory knowledge of the local geography. In cases where dedicated cars will be used for extended periods of time, the Organizing Committee shall contemplate using more than one shift of driver per car.

12. RULES OF STAY

12.1 DISCIPLINARY MATTER

The Chiefs of Mission at the Pre-university Education Schools Tournament 2024 are responsible for the behavior of their mission. The missions fall under the jurisdiction of the Russia. During the Tournament, all athletes present on the competition areas are equal before the jury, the referees and themselves.

No one may use his rank to impose his views on sports matters. Civilian Members of the missions must conform to the disciplinary rules accepted by all other participants.

12.2 FORBIDDEN ACTIONS

In conformity with the statutes and traditions of CISM, any political or religious action during the Tournament, in particular the dissemination of propaganda documents, pictures, brochures, reviews, etc. is strictly forbidden. Any contravention shall result in the exclusion of the mission from further competition and the case shall be referred to the CISM Discipline Commission.

13. DRESS CODE

13.1 UNIFORM

All participating athletes must wear their national (summer) academy (school) uniform during official ceremonies (if such a uniform is available in the educational institution).

The presentation of medals can be done in sports uniforms, if, for organizational reasons it is not possible to wear academy (school) uniform, for example, when the awarding immediately follows a competition sports event. But, whenever possible, the medal ceremony will be done in academy (school) uniform.

To enhance the military character of the Pre-university Education Schools Tournament 2024 officials of the delegation during official events must wear a military uniform (if they are military personnel).

13.2 NATIONAL TRACK SUIT

It is highly recommended for competitors to have at least one official tracksuit (training) and official jersey/polo, preferably in the national colors with the









name of the country, official shorts, socks and sport-shoes. Caps are not mandatory. 13.3 CIVILIAN DRESS

Civilian dress may be worn on cultural activities organized by the Organizing Committee as well as during the free times between the competitions and ceremonies.

14. MEDICAL CARE AND INSURANCES

14.1 MEDICAL CARE

Medical centers on the athlete's accommodation will be established to deal with minor cases. Serious cases will be treated at a full service hospital. First aid and evacuation service will be available on sport venues and athlete's accommodation.

The Organizing Committee will bear all necessary emergency (first aid) hospital/medical center care expenses.

All other expenses, such as hospitalizations, surgical operations and any other special treatments, homecoming in case of disease by illness or accident, other expenses on account of illness/accident such as compensation loss of income or non-emergency dental/medical care will be charged to the user themselves.

If for any reason the injured athlete's delegation refuses the medical arrangements proposed by the Organizing Committee, the costs of hospitalization or treatment at other facility will be the responsibility of the delegation.

In case the mission brings any drugs to treat its team and the staff, it has to declare so through the proper from named "Declaration of Drugs Form" which you can find enclosed to the forms of the Final Entry.

14.2 INSURANCE

The Organizing Committee will not be responsible for any claim for loss, injury or damage arising from the holding of the Tournament.

Points related to medical coverage:

> for the organizing country: obligation to give first aid and to take care of the hospital. Organizing Committee can practice non-invasive sports medicine.

> for the guest nation: obligation to take out insurance for all the care that can be given to the persons in the delegation.

Organizing Committee is not responsible for post-injury medical follow-up, nor for any medical or psychological consequences resulting from the injury.

The Missions must have the appropriate insurance to cover travel, accidents and health risks disease as they are not under the responsibility of the Organizing Committee nor CISM.

15. SECURITY AND ACCREDITATION

15.1 GENERAL ASPECT

The Organizing Committee, through its Security Department, is responsible for the security of all missions and guests during the competitions, official transportation and at accommodation sites, authorized stay.

15.2 SECURITY MEASURES

All participating delegations and national staff will be registered and will receive the appropriate credentials to access the sports venues, lodgings and all other sites that can be required. The use of accreditation will provide the necessary control and security measures ensuring the smooth flow of personnel while restricting access









of non-authorized persons, providing a safe environment for all.

Delegations must complete «Final Entry - Personal data for accreditation and visas support to visit the Russian Federation». And send to Organizing Committee with color photos in good quality (35mm*45mm min size in the format of JPG, with the resolution rate no less than 300dpi) of all members of the delegation before 22 April 2024.

16. ENTERTAINMENT, CULTURAL AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Guided tours of the host city will be planned for participants. The tours will include the important tourist sights of city Tula.

Also, joint educational programs will be provided for all participants of the tournament.

17. DOPING TESTS

Anti-doping tests will not be carried out during the Pre-university Education Schools Tournament 2024.

18. AWARDS

The awards will be presented at the end of each competition, at which time the winner(s) will be saluted by the playing of the national anthem, while the national flags of the medal winners are raised.

General Status of the Host Country

Russia is vast. endless. Russia is Russia is timeless and eternal. Yet Russia can still surprise. Bounded by 12 seas of the Atlantic, Arctic and Pacific Oceans, the country's 17.1 million km include one-eighth of the earth's inhabited surface area. In addition to being the largest, the Russian Federation is one of the world's northernmost countries.



European Russia, the most densely populated, urbanized, and industrialized region. Seventy-eight percent of the population lives in this area. Two large industrial cities are located above the Arctic Circle: Murmansk on the Kola Peninsula and Norilsk in Siberia.



Russia is a country of incomparable beauty, variety and extremes, encompassing the snow-capped peaks of the and Caucasus Ural mountains, the seemingly infinite Siberian forests, the broad rivers stretching across the continent and deserts and grasslands of its central steppe. Russia is the land of Lake Baikal - the deepest and purest on Earth – and of the Volga, the longest river in Europe. No other country extends across nine of the

earth's twenty-four standard time zones; as Russians in Vladivostok sit down to enjoy their evening family meals, their countrymen in Kaliningrad are rising to greet the sun's morning rays.









Cultural Status of the Host Country History of culture

In order to understand Russian culture, it is important to realize that it is a unique symbiosis of European and Asian traditions. Russia has part of its roots

in European culture where the ideas of goodness, honor, and freedom have similar meaning as in the West. The Mongols, conquered and controlled Russian lands for over 200 years. That brought Tatar blood into Slavic mix, creating modern Russian nation.

When Moscow liberated itself from the Tartars in 1480, the modern Russian state was born.



The Russian Orthodox Church, isolated from the rest of Christianity, developed independently as a national church.



Culture

Since representatives of so many nationalities live in Russia, its culture is also very diverse.

Russian culture has produced a number of world-famous artists and writers.

Five Russian artists whose paintings are included in the golden fund of world art: Ivan Aivazovsky, Viktor Vasnetsov, Ivan Shishkin, Ilya Repin, Isaac Levitan.







Literature would not be the same without Alexander Pushkin, Sergey Esenin, Mikhail Lermontov, Leo Tolstoy, Fyodor Dostoevsky.

Russian classical music contains the creative heritage of such great composers as Pyotr Tchaikovsky, Mikhail Glinka, Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov.

Russian ballet has been one of the hallmarks of Russian culture for centuries. It is rightfully recognized as the best in the world, and the names of outstanding artists have become synonymous with grace, skill and dedication to their work.

Radio, television, the first artificial satellite, color photography and much more are inscribed in the history of Russian inventions. These discoveries marked the beginning of the phenomenal development of various fields in science and technology.

Orthodoxy

Russian Orthodoxy, a branch of Christianity, is deeply rooted in Russian culture. The majority of Russians are Christians.

Russian folklore

Folklore is still very popular in Russian cities and towns. You may have heard about Palekh Art, Khokhloma painting, Gzhel ceramics, Russian «basnya» poems and folk songs. Traditions is what keeps Russian culture unique and alive to this day.



Sports Policies and Status of the Host Country

Sport has always been one of Russia's top national priorities. Soviet and Russian athletes have always been prominent on the international sport arena, excelling in Olympic sports and among the top medal winners at the Olympic Games and World Championships.









The Federal Government allocates substantial funds to develop both high performance sports and citizen participation.

Hosting major international sporting events provides a perfect opportunity to welcome guests from all over the world, share the celebration of sport and youth, and increase the social benefits created by these events.

In Russia there were held such important international sports events as the 27th Summer Universiade 2013 in Kazan, the Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games 2014 in Sochi, the FINA World Aquatics Championships, FINA World Masters Championships 2015 in Kazan.

Moreover, Sochi was chosen as the host city for the 3rd CISM Military World Winter



Games at the 70th General Assembly and Congress of the International Military Sports Council in Kuwait City, Kuwait in 2015. The Games were held with great success in sports venues built for the 2014 Winter Olympic Games.

Russia was the host nation for the 2018 FIFA World Cup. The matches were



held in the stadiums of 11 Russian cities: Kaliningrad, Kazan, Moscow, Nizhny Novgorod, Rostov-on-Don, Saint Petersburg, Samara, Saransk, Sochi, Volgograd and Yekaterinburg. This was the first football World Cup ever held in Eastern Europe, and the first held in Europe since 2006.









In 2022, the 3rd CISM World Cadet Games were held in St. Petersburg.

The Games were attended by 591 athletes, coaches and officials from 20 CISM member states.

The Games received the highest appraisal from the leadership of the International Military Sports Council and the participants of the competition.





annual CISM organizational event, the 78th General Assembly and Congress, took place in Moscow.

Representatives of 76 states took part in the events of the Assembly, 24 of which participated via a videoconference organized with the city of Brussels.



The CISM delegates took part in the celebrations on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the Central Sports Club of the Army.









Tula is one of the oldest cities in Russia. In the distant past, the Slavic tribe of Vyatichi lived on the territory of the Tula region. In 1054, their lands became part of the Chernigov Principality. Tula was first mentioned in the Nikon Chronicle of the 12th century in 1146.

At the end of the 19th - beginning of the 20th centuries, large enterprises of the metallurgical, metalworking, military, and sugar industries appeared in Tula, which, together with the arms factory reconstructed in 1870-1873, were on a par with the largest industrial enterprises of the Russian Empire.

During the Russian Civil War, Tula was the center of the armament of the Red Army.

In the 20th century Tula and the region, the machine-building, chemical and

coal industries received further development, new research institutes and design bureaus appeared, continuing the traditions of Tula gunsmiths.

Tula - Features

One of the features of Tula is its proximity to Moscow (2-3 hours by car or train).

Tula is a large industrial and commercial centers in Russia. The machine building, and metalworking.





commercial centers in Russia. The leading industries are ferrous metallurgy,

Tula is known for three activities of local residents rooted deep in the history of the city: the production of weapons, samovars, and gingerbread. Each of them is represented in the city by the Museum of Weapons, the Museum of Samovars, and the Museum of Tula Gingerbread.







In the Russian language there is such a phraseological unit as "Don't go to Tula with your samovar" which means doing something useless.

In total, on the territory of Tula there are more than 300 objects of cultural heritage: monuments of architecture and urban planning, history. The Tula Kremlin, the oldest building in the city, is an architectural monument of the 16th century. "Yasnaya Polyana", the house-museum of Leo Tolstoy (author of the novel «War and Peace»), is located about 14 km south-west of Tula. To visit all the sights of Tula, you will need at least 2-3 days.



The center of Tula is Lenin Square located near the Tula Kremlin. The main street of the city is Lenin Avenue - the busiest street in the city with a lot of educational institutions, a drama theater, a philharmonic, monuments to various cultural figures, monuments dedicated to the Second World War, various shops, restaurants, cafes, and supermarkets. Celebrations, parades and processions are held here.

Weather Conditions

The climate of Tula is moderately continental with distinct seasons. It is characterized by warm, long summers and moderately cold winters with frequent thaws. The average temperature in June is plus 23 degrees Celsius.




