C. Anti-doping control

- 1. An athlete who achieves a CISM World or Continental Record shall submit to a doping control, in accordance with the current CISM anti-doping rules and the specific sports regulations.
- 2. The result of the anti-doping test shall be presented to the CISM General Secretariat and will be added to the "Request for ratification of a CISM record" if it's the case for the related sport discipline (Form 151.6/e, appendix 12).

New text

C. Anti-doping control

1. An athlete who achieves a CISM World or Continental Record shall submit to a doping control, in accordance with the current CISM anti-doping rules and the specific sports regulations is not automatically obliged to submit to doping control.

The CISM anti-doping commission can prioritize the testing of an athlete who achieves a CISM World or Continental Record within the scope of the Annual CISM Anti-Doping Tests Distribution Plan (TDP).

The CISM anti-doping commission can request the Local Organizing Committee to carry out an extra TDP test when observing the real need to perform the test in an athlete who achieves a CISM World or Continental Record.

Attention must be given when the athlete is affiliated with an International Federation and the record will impact a record of that IF. If the IF regulation requires the athlete must be tested, the procedure must be carried out so that the athlete does not have prejudice in the approval of all possible performances. The PCSC will ensure that the knowledge about these IF requirements is in the specific sports regulations.

2. In case of testing of the athlete, Tthe result of the anti-doping test shall be presented to the CISM General Secretariat and will be added to the "Request for ratification of a CISM record" if it's the case for the related sport discipline (Form 151.6/e, appendix 12).

A. The CISM Sports Commission

All the members of the TUEC should be medical doctors, or must have a deep knowledge and understanding of pharmacology, pharmacokinetic and related areas.

D. The CISM Discipline Commission

The CISM Discipline Commission has, with the assistance of the CISM anti-doping manager, the responsibility to decide on any sanction to be applied on an athlete, or any other person who infringed a provision of the WADC. to hand over positive doping cases by the following:

In principle, a positive doping case will be handled by the International Federation (IF) of which the athlete is a member. The ruling of the IF will normally apply for competitions both under the auspices of the IF and under the auspices of CISM. By this procedure the case will be handled by
