Only military personnel in active duty may participate in the competitions (CISM Regulations, Art. 7.23, item A.).

* If a nation participates in all three disciplines, it may add one Deputy Chief of Mission and one Medical Staff/Physiotherapist

** Only for the countries that have approved members on the CISM Sports Committee – Judo, Taekwondo or Wrestling. CSC members are not included in maximum number of participants and these CSC members are the only personal permitted to arrive early (two days maximum) to oversee/coordinate the final preparations prior to the commencement of the competition.



3. TRANSPORTATION TO/FROM THE COMPETITION VENUE

The cost of travel to and from Germany will be the responsibility of the participating country. The organizer will ensure the transportation from the mentioned places of arrival/departure in Germany to the designated competition and will provide transport during the conduct of the event.

4. ENTRY FORMS

Preliminary Agreement:	25th April 2025
Final Entry:	23rd May 2025

- On the final entry form, the participating mission shall indicate a valid and operated phone/mobile phone and fax number as well as an email address in case the organizing committee needs to contact them.
- All names mentioned in agreements must be written in Latin letters as stated in the passport.

5. CONDITIONS OF STAY

- During their stay, the missions are guests of the German Federal Armed Forces. Suitable board, lodging and local transportation during the competition will be provided by the organizer. The consumer must pay extra expenses such as fees for telephone calls, laundry services, additional drinks etc. Any costs associated with the stay of missions before 22nd to 29th June 2025 must be paid by the respective missions.



- Additional personnel will not be accepted without an official written permission of the organizer.
- The cost of travel to the point of arrival and from the point of departure in Germany is solely the responsibility of the participating nation. The organizer will provide transportation from the points of arrival in Germany (Warendorf-Area) and return. Medical emergencies (first aid) will be the responsibility of the German Federal Armed Forces. The German Federal Armed Forces will provide medical support for all scheduled competitions. The German Federal Armed Forces will not be responsible for any advanced medical expenses, including hospital stays, surgical procedures, and/or other medical care beyond first aid. All participants must travel with their own medical coverage. Special medical treatment is under the responsibility of the participating nations.
- Delegations are authorized to arrange accommodations outside those provided by the host nation, as long as they indicate this choice in the Preliminary Agreement. Those opting for this will be fully responsible for all logistics, including accommodation management, transportation, security, and associated costs. Please ensure compliance with the event's accommodation guidelines and communicate any arrangements to the LOC for coordination purposes.

6. CUSTOMS AND VISA PROCEDURES

- Recommend the participants to contact the Host country Embassy in their own country.
- In order to avoid problems with deadlines for granting Visas adopted by different countries and embassies, we recommend that participants contact the Embassy of the host country in their own country and schedule an appointment **soon after sending the Preliminary Agreement**.
- If the championship requires that the participants to bring weapons and ammunitions, indicate clearly the procedures they have to meet in order to import these goods in your territory.



7. REGULATIONS

Judo

- The competitions will be conducted with the CISM Regulations, CISM Judo Regulations, edition February 2025 in conjunction with the most updated International Judo Federation (IJF) Rules, to be presented and discussed during the Preliminary meeting will apply throughout.
- In case of arising of any contentious issues the CISM Regulations will be prevail.
- In line with the IJF regulations and the CISM Judo Regulations, the team competitions at the 1st CISM World Martial Arts Championship 2025 will feature a Mixed Team competition in Olympic weight categories: -57 kg, -70 kg, and +70 kg for females, and -73 kg, -90 kg, and +90 kg for males. As a result, the separate team competitions will not be held at this event.
- Each mission is allowed to bring only one competitor per weight category. In addition, each mission may bring one additional competitor in a weight class of your choice.

Taekwondo

- The championship will be governed by the CISM Taekwondo Sport Regulations, edition February 2020.
- In case of arising of any contentious issues the CISM Regulations will be prevail.

Wrestling

- The championship will be governed by the CISM Wrestling Sport Regulations, edition 1 March 2020, in conjunction with the UWW Rules, edition January 2023, to be presented and discussed during the Preliminary meeting will apply throughout.
- In case of arising of any contentious issues the CISM Regulations will be prevail.



8. ANTI-DOPING

- Anti-Doping tests will be conducted in accordance with the CISM Regulations – Chapter IX, CISM Anti-Doping Rules, the concerned CISM Sports Regulations, the concerned International Federation Rules, and all WADA rules, mainly the World Anti-Doping Code, and the International Standard for Testing.
- The number and type of tests, as well the athletes to be tested shall be determined by the CISM Anti-Doping Commission. These procedures will follow the concerned CISM Test Distribution Plan (TDP).
- In case an athlete has a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE), the Chief of Delegation should send this TUE to the CISM GS until 30 days before the Opening Ceremony. This TUE will be submitted to the TUE Commission to analysis and further approval.

9. UNIFORMS

- Military uniform is mandatory for the opening and closing ceremonies, as well as for official invitations. The Chief of Mission is required to wear Class A (Jacket and Tie) at these activities
- Remind the participants that the uniforms are mandatory for the opening and closing ceremonies.
- Request the participants' flag and that the Chief of delegation to check if their respective national anthem, available on the CISM Extranet (<http://members.milспорт.one/officialdocuments/protocol-events-guidelines>), is up to date and can be used in sports competitions.



10. WEATHER INFORMATION

The weather for end of June can range from a daily high of 23° to 27° Celsius to a daily low of 17° to 22° Celsius.
