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3. MILITARY DRESS CODE

The CISM General Assembly and Congress is a military event and organization with dress codes established by the Executive Committee.

As a reminder of the basics of military dress codes and the CISM Dress Code
Manual:

• <u>CIVILIAN CLOTHING</u>:

Civilian clothing should be clean and appropriate for the situation, neither too revealing nor too casual. It should be suitable for the context and may vary depending on the level of formality, ranging from a suit to more casual yet smart clothing, such as jeans and a polo shirt in an informal setting.

• CLASS B MILITARY UNIFORM:

Class B military attire is a less formal everyday service uniform, often worn for daily work duties. It usually consists of a jacket, but frequently a short-sleeved shirt or blouse, trousers or a skirt, and appropriate footwear. Rank insignia and decorations in the form of bars are worn on the garment.

• CLASS A MILITARY UNIFORM:

The Class A military uniform is a formal dress uniform, similar to civilian attire, consisting of a button-down shirt, trousers or skirt, and headgear. It is worn for official events or gatherings and is adorned with rank and unit insignia, medal decorations, and is complemented by dress shoes and, optionally, a belt.

• FULL DRESS MILITARY UNIFORM GALA (OPTIONAL) :

For an officer's full dress military uniform, the dress code is a spencer for men, which includes a white dress shirt, bow tie and polished or patent black shoes. Women follow a similar dress code, wearing long evening gowns.

As Monaco attaches great importance to compliance with the dress code, the Monegasque delegation, in agreement with CISM headquarters, wishes it to be applied during official ceremonies, the official opening cocktail reception and the official closing dinner, which H.S.H. Prince Albert II of Monaco will honor with His presence.



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4. ACCOMODATIONS

The official hotel for the 81st CISM General Assembly and Congress is located approximately 30 minutes by car (18.0 km) from Nice Côte d'Azur International Airport.

This 4-star hotel is located in the heart of the Principality of Monaco, close to the legendary Place du Casino de Monte Carlo, the new "Mareterra" district built on reclaimed land, and a few steps from the Place du Palais.

The CISM General Assembly will take place during the Grand Prix period. As a result, the Monegasque Delegation negotiated special full-board rates with the Fairmont Hotel, which are included in the hotel's services for the duration of the assembly.

Both the opening and closing ceremonies, as well as the sessions of the 81st General Assembly and Congress, will take place at the Fairmont Monte Carlo Hotel.

For hotel reservations, credit card details or a deposit is required to guarantee the booking. VISA **VISA** and MASTERCARD credit cards are accepted. The hotel will not accept cash payments.



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Any additional expenses will be charged to guests, and this payment must be made at check-out before departure.

The official arrival and departure dates for Delegations are defined below (if your trip on these dates is problematic, please contact the LOC:

 Departure: Saturday May 9th

General terms and conditions for room reservations:

Check-in: 3:00 p.m.Check-out: 12:00 p.m.

As per the contract with Fairmont Hotel, additional fees will be applied for early arrivals and late check-outs.



Fairmont Monte-Carlo will confirm the reservations no later than 45 days before delegations' arrival and cannot be reallocated without the agreement of both the hotel and the organizer.

According to the contract with Fairmont Mote-Carlo Hotel, the cancellation deadline is fixed March 6th, 2026 term of rigor. After this date, a 100% of the stay amount cancellation fee will apply.



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
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The prices shown in the table below include Accommodation and Full board lodging (breakfast, lunch and dinner with soft drinks and water). Except for the official opening cocktail reception and the official closing dinner, alcoholic beverages are at the applicant's expense and must be paid for at the time of ordering.

It is specified, in agreement with the CSIM headquarters, that inactive countries (those not up to date on their annual membership fees) will not be eligible for the reduced rates mentioned above; the standard rates will instead apply. The prices are €900 for a single room and €1.100 for a double room (prices include full board and lodging). In this context, the delegation's statutory status will be established upon final registration on March 1st, 2026. LOC, in coordination with CISM HQ, will notify the hotel staff of the delegation's current status (active or inactive) for pricing purposes.





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5. FACILITES

a. <u>Electricity and outlets</u>



The electricity supply in the Principality of Monaco is 220 volts and 50Hz. The power sockets are defined as follows.

Participants should therefore bring appropriate adapters.

b. Internet access



Free high-speed Wi-Fi internet access is available in the rooms and throughout the hotel. Delegates are therefore advised to bring their personal laptops to take advantage of the free Wi-Fi.

c. <u>Meals</u>



The hotel will serve all meals in accordance with international food safety standards and will indicate the composition of each dish to comply with all dietary restrictions and religious requirements. Please indicate your meal preference in your Final Entry and, if you have any dietary restrictions or special requirements, don't hesitate to get in touch with the Monaco Delegation to check availability.

d. <u>Accommodations</u>



In connection with the organization of the 81st General Assembly & Congress of the CISM in Monaco and in accordance with the measures adopted during the working meetings, we regret to inform you that the presence of children or teenagers cannot be accommodated. Should their accidental presence occur, the local organizing committee will not assume full responsibility for their services and will not permit their participation in official ceremonies and dinners.

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6. CONGRESS THEME

As part of the Monegasque Delegation's proposal, coordinated with the Peace and Sport Organization, the 2026 CISM Congress will explore the theme "Peace and Sport" through a series of presentations and activities, including the #white card photo and a Peace Football match. More information will be provided closer to the event.

7. COMPOSITION OF THE DELEGATION

Each delegation shall consist of one chief of delegation and one delegate, for a total of two members.

Delegations are responsible for registering additional members, such as BOD members, Commission members, PCSC members, etc., who may also be registered.

Only CISM authorities officially listed in the CISM directory will be accepted. If you have any questions or need to update the current composition of your delegation/commission/committee in the CISM Directory, please contact the CISM headquarters by email: cism@milsport.one

The Monegasque Delegation requests full attention to the delegation composition limit (a Chief of Delegation and one delegate), especially regarding assistants, to

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prevent unnecessary costs for participants. Non-compliance may result in additional charges for the participants or delegations.

8. SPOUSES AND PARTNERS PROGRAM

Spouses or partners are welcome, and a special program will be organized for them. Only spouses and partners can participate in this program. Registrations will be recorded according to the information provided via Annex 5 and must be confirmed the day before each visit by 6 p.m. for booking and logistical reasons.

This program will be held over three days:

Tuesday, May 5th : 8.30 a.m. to 15 p.m.
 Wednesday, May 6th : 8.30 a.m. to 15 p.m.
 Thursday, May 7th : 8.30 a.m. to 1 p.m.

9. CULTURAL DAY

The Monaco Delegation will organize a visit to cultural sites (3) on Friday, May 8th. The event schedule may change depending on the number of participants.

10. WEATHER CONDITIONS

In May, the weather in Monaco is mild and sunny, with average temperatures between 15 °C (59 °F) and 20 °C (68 °F). The month features many sunny days, but some rainy spells are possible.

It is advisable to bring a light jacket for evenings and mornings.

11. TRANSPORT

CISM delegations are responsible for their own travel to and from the point of entry into the Principality of Monaco.

The only point of arrival for CISM delegations is Airport Nice Côte d'Azur (ANCA), in Nice, France. Participants will be welcomed by the local organizing committee's logistics coordinators and transported to the Fairmont Hotel.

The Monegasque CISM delegation will exceptionally allow European delegations from neighboring countries to arrive by train. The arrival point will be Monaco Monte-Carlo station.

Arrival by road is strongly discouraged due to parking difficulties.

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The Monaco LOC will provide all the necessary transport for all official events organized during the General Assembly and Congress, considering the traffic restrictions linked to the installation of the circuit during this period, namely:

- 1 VAN (8pax): President –Secretary General Treasurer General
- 1 VAN (8 pax): CISM Vice-Presidents (Europe, Africa, Americas and Asia)
- 1 Minibus (25 pax) (Board of Directors members and CISM HQ)
- 1 Minibus (25 pax) (CISM Monaco, Commissions' members, and Authorities)
- 3 Buses (50 pax) (CISM Delegations)

12. VISAS

Citizens from countries outside the European Economic Area (EEA) or associated states need a Schengen visa to enter Monaco, since the Principality does not have its own visa policy and entry is primarily through France. EEA country nationals and Swiss citizens do not need a visa but must carry a valid passport or identity card.

The Monegasque Delegation is not in a position to intervene or interfere in the visa issuance process. If necessary, please contact CISM HQ to request a letter in support of your visa application.

a. Countries not requiring a visa:

Nationals of European Economic Area (EEA) countries, Switzerland, and France.

b. Countries requiring a visa:

All nationals from countries outside the EEA and Switzerland who do not have a visa exemption agreement with the Schengen area.

Important: visa application formalities must be completed at the embassy of the Schengen country that will be your point of entry into Europe, usually France.

Due to customs and border agreements with France, Monaco's visa policy is the same as that of the Schengen area. Citizens of all countries that require a visa to enter the Schengen area also need a visa for Monaco.

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c. Countries whose nationals require a visa for Monaco (Schengen area):

The list of countries whose citizens must apply for a short-stay Schengen visa (for a stay of less than 90 days) includes, but is not limited to:

- Africa: Algeria, Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Cape Verde, Comoros, Côte d'Ivoire, Egypt, Ethiopia, Kenya, Madagascar, Morocco, Mozambique, Nigeria, Senegal, Tanzania, and Tunisia.
- 2) Asia: Afghanistan, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, China, North Korea, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Iran, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Laos, Lebanon, Maldives, Mongolia, Nepal, Oman, Pakistan, Philippines, Qatar, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Turkey, Vietnam, and Yemen.
- 3) South America and the Caribbean: Bolivia, Cuba, Ecuador, Haiti, Jamaica, and Peru.
- 4) Other countries: Belarus, Fiji, and Russia.
- d. Citizens exempt from visa requirements (Schengen Area):

Citizens of the following countries may travel to the Schengen Area (including Monaco) without a visa for short stays (up to 90 days within a 180-day period): The United States, Canada, Australia, Japan, Brazil, the United Kingdom, and others also benefit from this exemption.

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13. MEDICAL CARE

The Local Organizing Committee will cover all emergency treatment costs (first aid) in a hospital or specialist medical center.

All other costs, such as hospitalization, surgery, and any other special treatment, repatriation in the event of illness or accident, and other expenses related to illness or accident, such as compensation for loss of income or non-urgent dental/medical care, are the responsibility of the user.

The Monaco Fire Brigade and the Emergency Medical and Resuscitation Service (SMUR) of the C.H.P.G. will provide any emergency care during the 81st General Assembly in Monaco.

The nearest hospital (approximately 5 minutes from the hotel) is designated as the referral hospital for the duration of the general & Congress meetings :

14. INSURANCE

The Local Organizing Committee shall not be liable for any claims for loss, injury or damage resulting from the holding of the 81st CISM General Assembly and Congress.

Points relating to medical cover:

- For the host country: obligation to administer first aid and transport to the nearest hospital.
- For the guest nation, it is mandatory to provide insurance coverage for all participants from that given nation.

The Local Organizing Committee is not responsible for post-injury medical followup or for any medical or psychological consequences resulting from the injury.

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Missions must have appropriate insurance to cover travel, accident and health risks, as these are not the responsibility of the Local Organizing Committee or CISM HQ.

15. SECURITY MEASURES

All participating delegations, national staff, and invited authorities will be registered and will receive the appropriate accreditation to access the venues, accommodation, and all other sites they need to access.

The Principality of Monaco is renowned as a haven of tranquility. To guarantee this quality of life, nearly 600 civil servants from the Public Safety Department and more than 1000 CCTV cameras contribute to this essential aspect of community life.

A constant presence on the ground and proximity to the population enable optimum security to be maintained without ever being intrusive, ensuring respect for people and property.

16. PRIVATE TOURISM IN THE PRINCIPALITY OF MONACO

For private tourism in Monaco, you can explore the Prince's Palace, the Monte Carlo Casino, the New National Museum of Monaco, The Oceanic Museum or The Prince's private car collection.
