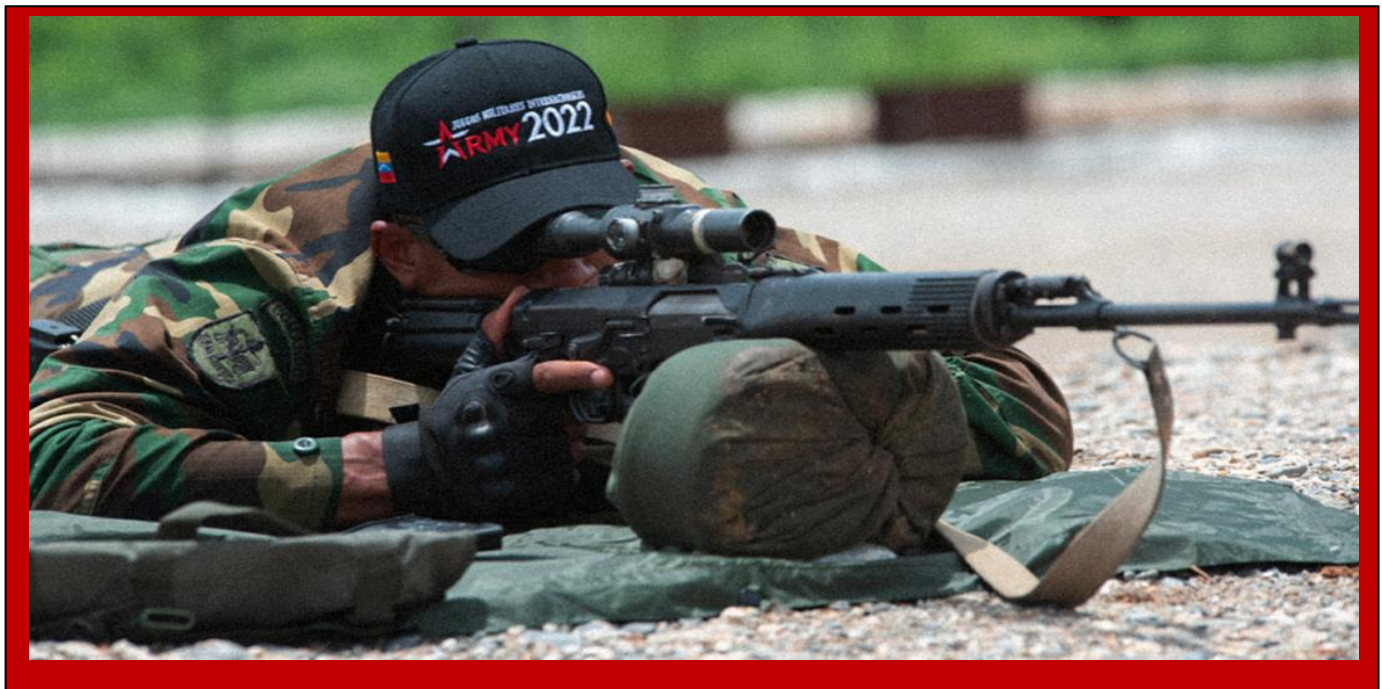

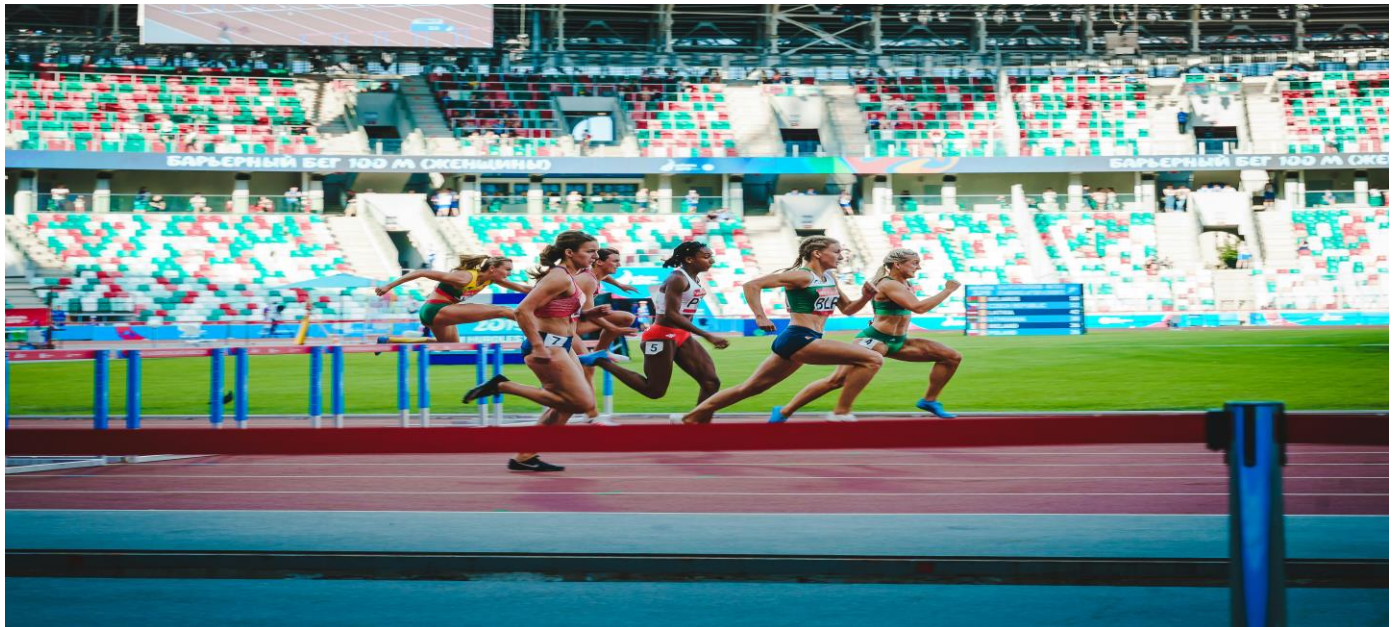

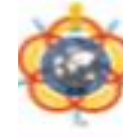

# BOLIVARIAN REPUBLIC OF VENEZUELA

## GENERAL SITUATION OF THE HOST COUNTRY

The Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, as established in its 1999 Constitution, is a democratic, participatory and leading, multiethnic and pluricultural society in a federal and decentralized State of justice, which consolidates the values of freedom, independence, peace, solidarity, the common good, territorial integrity, coexistence and the rule of law so that this and future generations; ensure the right to life, work, culture, education, social justice and equality without discrimination or subordination; and equally promotes peaceful cooperation between nations and promotes and consolidates Latin American integration in accordance with the principle of non-intervention and self-determination of peoples, the universal and indivisible guarantee of human rights, the democratization of international society, nuclear disarmament , ecological balance and environmental legal assets as the common and inalienable heritage of humanity. Our country is located in the northern part of South America and the Caribbean, made up of a continental area and a large number of islands and islets in the Caribbean Sea, whose capital and largest urban agglomeration is the city of Caracas, the capital, the which is located in the north of the country. Our nation has several natural attractions. Along its coast in the Caribbean, there are tropical resort islands, including Margarita Island and the Los Roques archipelago. To the northwest is the Andes mountains and the colonial city of Mérida an a cableway for visiting the Sierra Nevada National Park.

Venezuela has an important plastics arts, scenic and musical cultural movement. Plastic arts and crafts have great importance in Venezuela. The most outstanding cultural characteristic is music, a mixture of local, European and African rhythms. We have a wealth of natural biodiversity calculated at about 386 species of mammals, 1,463 species of birds, 377 species of reptiles, 340 species of amphibians, 1,860 species of fish and 15,636 species of plants, in a multicultural and polyethnic territory.



## POLITICAL SYSTEM OF THE BOLIVARIAN REPUBLIC OF VENEZUELA

The Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, as established in its 1999 Constitution, is a democratic, participatory and leading, multiethnic and pluricultural society in a federal and decentralized State of justice, which consolidates the values of freedom, independence, peace, solidarity, the common good, territorial integrity and coexistence.



It promotes peaceful cooperation between nations and promotes and consolidates Latin American integration in accordance with the principle of non-intervention and self-determination of peoples, the universal and indivisible guarantee of human rights, the democratization of international society, nuclear disarmament, ecological balance and environmental legal rights.

The government of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela and the political entities that comprise it is and will always be democratic, participatory, elective, decentralized, alternative, responsible, pluralistic and with revocable mandates.

The Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela is considered a Nation in constant development and prosperity, with an economy based primarily on the extraction and refining of oil and other minerals, as well as agricultural and industrial activities. It was classified as an upper middle income country. It is also recognized for being one of the megadiverse countries, with an irregular geography that combines arid regions, jungle, extensive savannahs in the Llanos and Andean environments. The country has the largest reserves of oil in the world, the ninth largest reserves of natural gas, and the sixteenth largest reserves of gold. In addition, it has the largest set of



protected areas in Latin America, called Areas Under Special Administration Regime, which cover approximately 63% of the national territory. Its population reached 30 million inhabitants in 2012, and is widely diverse, because it integrates European and mestizo ethnic groups, and to a lesser extent African, indigenous and Asian.

Politically, it is constituted as a Democratic, social, law and justice, autonomous and sovereign Federal State, whose sovereignty is enshrined in its Act of Independence signed in 1811. The Venezuelan territory is subdivided into 24 federal entities, 23 States, a Capital District, which includes the city of Caracas and 12 Federal Dependencies in aquatic areas. There are also 216 other islands, islets and cays, belonging to some states.

## ECONOMIC SITUATION OF THE HOST COUNTRY

Agriculture, together with extractive activities, makes up the Primary Sector of the economy. It has a long historical tradition since for more than four centuries, agriculture was the central axis in the formation and organization of the Venezuelan geo-economic space. Venezuela's economy is oriented towards the export of raw materials. The main economic activity of Venezuela is the exploitation and refining of oil for export. The extraction and refining is carried out by the state company “Petróleos de Venezuela (PDVSA)”.

The economy in Venezuela is of vital importance due to its impact on income generation, employment, economic growth, macroeconomic stability, economic diversification and social development.

It is the country with the largest oil reserves, since, according to the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC), it has 20% of the world total, to which we must add some other minerals such as high quality iron, bauxite, gold and diamonds in addition to its enormous coltan reserves. Another activity that generates resources in our country is the activity of the tourism sector, which is very diverse, thanks to the natural and scenic resources we have, as well as an infrastructure to provide services to national and international tourists.





## CULTURAL STATUS OF THE HOST COUNTRY

The evolutionary process of contemporary Venezuelan culture derives from pre-Hispanic, Hispanic and African roots, consolidated in the colonial centuries. Cultural specificity has been achieved with an intense process of transculturation and miscegenation. Although the country is largely monolingual with Spanish being the main language, numerous languages are spoken in Venezuela. In this way, the Venezuelan Constitution recognizes Spanish as the official language of the country and some thirty native languages (such as Wayú, Warao, Pemón, among others) as officially used by indigenous peoples, but indicates that they must be respected in the entire territory of the Republic. Most of the latter with few speakers (less than 1% of the total population).



On the other hand, although Venezuelan sign language is not recognized as an official language at the level of the national Constitution, it does recognize the right of the deaf-mute community to express themselves through it and the right to be informed by this language by through public and private television. An indigenous people is a differentiated human group that lives in a geographical space, has its own cultural characteristics and a common history. In our country, like the rest of the American continent, there are various indigenous peoples, who are descendants of all those communities that originally populated the American continent and constitute a fundamental factor of our identity. The indigenous influence is limited to some words in the lexicon and gastronomy.

The Africa influence in the same way, in addition to musical instruments such as the drum. The Spanish influence was more important and in particular came from the region of Andalusia and the Extremadura, places of origin of the majority of settlers in the Caribbean area during the colonial era. As an example of this we can mention the buildings, part of the music, the Catholic religion and language. An obvious Spanish influence is bullfighting and certain features of gastronomy.

In the international cultural context, the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela has had a firm position in defense of cultural diversity through mechanisms that guarantee a fruitful intercultural dialogue to build, together with all the countries already committed to this effort, a more fair, tolerant and supportive. Another cultural area refers to art and traditions that are combined into a single national feeling, through exhibitions in museums and places where the traditions and cultural manifestations of our country are revived.





## MODERN CULTURE

In the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, a relationship is established between development and culture, for which the categories of modernity occupy a prominent place, centrally focused on modernity as the axis of national development. Taking as a scenario a historical vision of modernity up to the current times, contemporaneity, with a panoramic vision, stopping at the highest points to observe especially its effects on culture and education in the country, we can say that we have an important plastic art, scenic and musical cultural movement. Plastics arts and crafts are of great importance, with music as the most prominent cultural characteristic, in a mix of local, European and African rhythms.

Venezuelan painting and sculpture have traditionally been influenced by historical themes and the political process experienced by the country during its Independence. Many nineteenth-century paintings and sculptures are often presented as representations of key moments in history, heroic deeds, and allegories of the nation. Those who stood out in this phase were Juan Lovera, Arturo Michelena, Martín Tovar y Tovar, Tito Salas, among others. There is also the case of Pedro Centeno Vallenilla, who stood out for the exuberance of the bodies, the neoclassical forms and the allegories of miscegenation.



However, romantic painting had its greatest exponent in Cristóbal Rojas, who largely deviated from those generalized themes. Among those who have greatly contributed to kinetic art have been Carlos Cruz-Díez, Jesús Soto and Juvenal Ravelo.

This particular trend has become very popular in the country, and there are works of this type in various cultural institutions, and even on highways, in the subway and in airports such as Maiquetía. Abstractionism and symbolism had one of its greatest developers in Armando Reverón, whose work is beginning to be rediscovered and recognized internationally Alejandro Otero also stood out in abstractionism and kineticism, while social realism was linked to the work of César Rengifo. Great landscape painters have been Manuel Cabré, Luis Álvarez de Lugo, among others, standing out in the painting of El Ávila hill. Another name is Pedro León Zapata, recognized for being a famous caricaturist. Other trends in the pictorial arts that can be seen in Venezuela in the works of the Venezuelan colonial period where religious motifs associated with the Virgin Mary, the nativity and the life of Jesus are predominant in said historical period. Another less academic but very popular form at the end of the 20th century and beginning of the



21st century is muralism and in which a large number of designs and trends are found. Francisco Narváez, Alejandro Colina, Víctor Valera, Harry Abend, Gertrud Goldschmidt, Lía Bermúdez, among others, stand out in sculpture. Activities and creations in the field of graphic design have also had a special place in the country.

## RELIGIONS

Religions in Venezuela are characterized by being established in a country with a non-denominational State that constitutionally guarantees freedom of worship, although its legislation also finances a variety of religious institutions duly registered with the Venezuelan State.

Such as South American nations, it is a predominantly Catholic nation. Catholic Christianity was introduced after the Spanish colonization of Venezuela and would subsequently increase after the arrival of migratory flows coming mainly from countries with a Catholic majority, such as Spain, Portugal and Italy. However, some indigenous peoples of Venezuela preserve in different degrees their own religions traditions, while others sycretism his own faith transform theirself to catholicism



One of the most widespread religious traditions in the Venezuelan community, sometimes carried out even by atheists or agnostic people, is the practice of asking for a blessing. Generally, a person asks a family member or a respected person from a generation older than his or her to ask God for his protection. After this, the other person usually responds (God bless you), (God keep you) or other similar expressions. This practice is commonly used as a respectful greeting or farewell.

On the legal side, the Venezuelan Constitution protects freedom of worship, as long as religious practice does not violate morality, decency or public order. Likewise, in Venezuela there is a regulatory body for religious activity known as the General Directorate of Justice and Cults (DGJC), which is attached to the Ministry of Popular Power for Interior Relations, Justice and Peace of Venezuela.



## VENEZUELAN FOLKLORE

Our country has a wide variety of folkloric manifestations thanks to its cultural diversity. The unique mix of aboriginal tradition with the influence of Spanish colonizers, African slaves and the immigration processes of the 19th and 20th centuries give enormous richness to Venezuelan folklore. In addition, it has also been nourished by the resources provided by geography in each region of the country. For this reason, there are practices and customs unique to each locality that coexist in harmony with national traditions.

These are some of the main folklore expressions of Venezuela:

- **Musical genres:** among the most popular styles of Venezuelan music, the joropo, the Zuliana bagpipe, the Guianese calypso, the coastal drums, the parranda and the peasant merengue stand out, but there are many more.
- **Dances, troupes and festivities:** there are many dances and festive expressions in Venezuela, among them the carnivals celebrated throughout the country, the Dancing Devils of Yare, the Zaragozas of Sanare, the Jokili of Colonia Tovar, the Carite, the Burriquita, the Sebucán and traditional music dances, such as joropo or drums.
- **Art and crafts:** Venezuelans usually combine materials that nature gives them with other modern and industrial materials to create their works, mainly for ceramic work, baskets, wood carvings, textiles for hammocks, musical instruments, ornaments and traditional toys, among others. others.



- **Traditional outfits:** the traditional clothing of the Venezuelan is based mainly on fabrics, such as Andean ruanas, leather garments, such as boots and hats, and other costumes and footwear, such as the liqui liqui, the joropera skirt, the guayuco, the espadrilles and further.

- **Gastronomy:** among the dishes that stand out in Venezuelan cuisine, we can mention the pabellón criollo, the arepa, the cachapa, the tequeños, the casabe, the Black roast, the hallaca, the fried fish, the “Tres en uno” juice and a wide variety of sweets and desserts.



- **Oral tradition:** Venezuelan folklore includes a vast repertoire of stories, stories, myths, legends, tales, superstitions and sayings, among which the legend of “El Silbón” stands out, the myth of “María Lionza”, the story “El Conuco de Tío Conejo” and many more.
- **Others:** there are many more folkloric expressions in Venezuela, including religious manifestations, such as the San Benito Festival or the Divina Pastora festival, traditional architecture, such as indigenous homes or buildings from the colonial period, and multiple traditions of the different indigenous peoples.

## SPORTS POLICIES AND STATUS OF THE HOST COUNTRY

In this sense, within the work of government, sport acquires great significance, given that in addition to being an activity directly related to physical health and the good use of free time, it involves competitive and representative activities, the creation of organizational structures and therefore, administrative, whether it is managed as a private company or as a public company. In the sphere of practicing physical sports activities there is a fact that is noted with crystal clarity. The progressive importance that organizations in recent years have been acquiring in sport in its dimension of individual and collective practice. A growing part of the population has gradually incorporated sports into their lifestyle. Now, this increase in sports practice has by no means been unidirectional. On the contrary, we have witnessed a marked process of differentiation in the demand for sports practice, to which the sports supply system has not been able to adequately respond.

The Ministry of Popular Power for Sports is the staff of the National Public Administration, responsible for formulating the national sports policies, for the purposes of which it is responsible for regulating, coordinating, planning, and promoting the systematic development of physical and sports activities throughout the country territory.



In the Bolivarian National Armed Forces, sports are governed by the Sports Federation of the Bolivarian National Armed Forces, which is a social organization that promotes sports in charge of promoting, planning, programming, organizing, directing, coordinating, supervising and evaluating sports. physical activity and education in the



military sports sub-system authorized for represent the country's military sport in all disciplines and modalities before the nations of the world, consequently being the maximum governing body of sport in the military sub-system throughout the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela. The Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, through the Ministry of Popular Power for Sports and the Sports Federation of the Bolivarian National Armed Forces (FEDEFANB), has established guidelines, which are contemplated in the Organic Law of Sports, Physical Activity and Physical Education of our country, through which it has been possible to develop national and international technical cooperation strategies, deploying the capacities for negotiation, formulation and evaluation of projects and incorporating the national sports organization into the scientific, technological and financial benefits provided by the multilateral and bilateral, governmental and non-governmental organizations in sports matters. This strategy has been decisive in the achievements achieved by our country in sports. The success of the candidacy campaigns for the World Cadet Games, formalized through the signing of the contract at the 78th CISM General Assembly & Congress - Moscow (RUS) and Brussels (BEL) – 2023, is an example of the commitment of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, with the brother member countries of the International Council of Military Sports (CISM), for which, we prepare with joy and jubilation as hosts of this majestic sporting event.



## HOST CITY: **CARACAS**

Caracas is the Capital of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela and the most populated city in this country. Since the 19th century it has been considered the center of political and economic power in Venezuela. It is located in the central-northern coastal area of the country, 12 km from the coast of the Caribbean Sea and is located within a mountainous valley.<sup>7</sup> Although it is located close to the coast, the city is located at almost 900 meters of altitude, separated from the central coast of Vargas, by the Coastal Mountain Range and which, as it passes through the urban center, is constituted as the El Ávila National Park. The Caracas-La Guaira highway serves as the main communication route between the city and the coastal state of La Guaira, as well as the Simón Bolívar International Airport of Maiquetía and the port of La Guaira, the second port in the country.

Caracas was founded on July 25, 1567 under the name of Santiago de León de Caracas by Diego de Losada, after the failed attempts of Francisco Fajardo.

As the capital, it houses the main headquarters of the organizations that constitute the powers of the State, these being: the Executive (Presidency of the Republic), Legislative (National Assembly), Judicial (Supreme Court of Justice), Citizen (Republican Moral Council) and Electoral (National Electoral Council)



Among its sites of interest are the Parque Central Urban Complex, the University City of Caracas (Unesco World Heritage Site) and headquarters of the UCV; Some of the engineering architectures are the Museum of Contemporary Art of Caracas, the Humboldt Hotel, the Teresa Carreño Theater, the Simón Bolívar Center, the Paseo Los Próceres, the Plaza Altamira, the Parque del Este, Esfera Caracas, the Distribuidor la Araña , Paseo Colón, the Federal Legislative Palace, Plaza Bolívar and the surrounding buildings such as the Cathedral of Caracas, the Sacred Museum, the Archbishop's Palace, the Municipal Palace,



the Chapel of Santa Rosa de Lima, the Yellow House, the Principal Theater and the Capital District Government building.

The city is also known for being a milestone of modern architecture worldwide during the 20th century, among the renowned works include: the Villa Planchart by Gio the floating clouds the auditorium magna by Alexander Calder, the Casa González

Gorronдона by Richard Neutra, the Banaven Center by Philip Johnson, the Táchira Club by Fruto Vivas, the Villa Monzeglio by Antonio Montini, the.Viaducto.Nueva.República by Riccardo Morandi, the Hotel Ávila by Wallace .Harrison,.the La Rinconada Hippodrome by Roberto Burle Marx,.the Poliedro.de.Caracas by Jimmy Alcock.



The capital of Venezuela, Caracas, has been characterized over time by an architecture that reflects the many styles and historical moments that this South American country has gone through. Located in the Venezuelan capital, Los Próceres, along with Paseo Los Ilustres, Paseo Los Símbolos and Paseo Los Precursores, constitute a complex network of recreation and squares known as “The System of Nationality”, whose name is due to the great struggle independence from Colombia, Bolivia, Ecuador, Peru and of course Venezuela.

The Armando Reverón Museum of Contemporary Art of Caracas, formerly known as the Sofía Ímber Museum of Contemporary Art of Caracas, is a modern art museum located in the Parque Central Urban Complex of Caracas. It was founded on August 30, 1973 by the journalist and art promoter Sofía Ímber (director between 1973 and 2001). Opened in 1974, it is the most important art museum in Venezuela. Among the 5,000 pieces in its collection, artists such as Pablo Picasso, Claude Monet, Vasili Kandinski, Fernand Léger, Piet Mondrian, Jesús Soto, Alexander Calder, Georges Braque, Francis Bacon and Andy Warhol stand out.



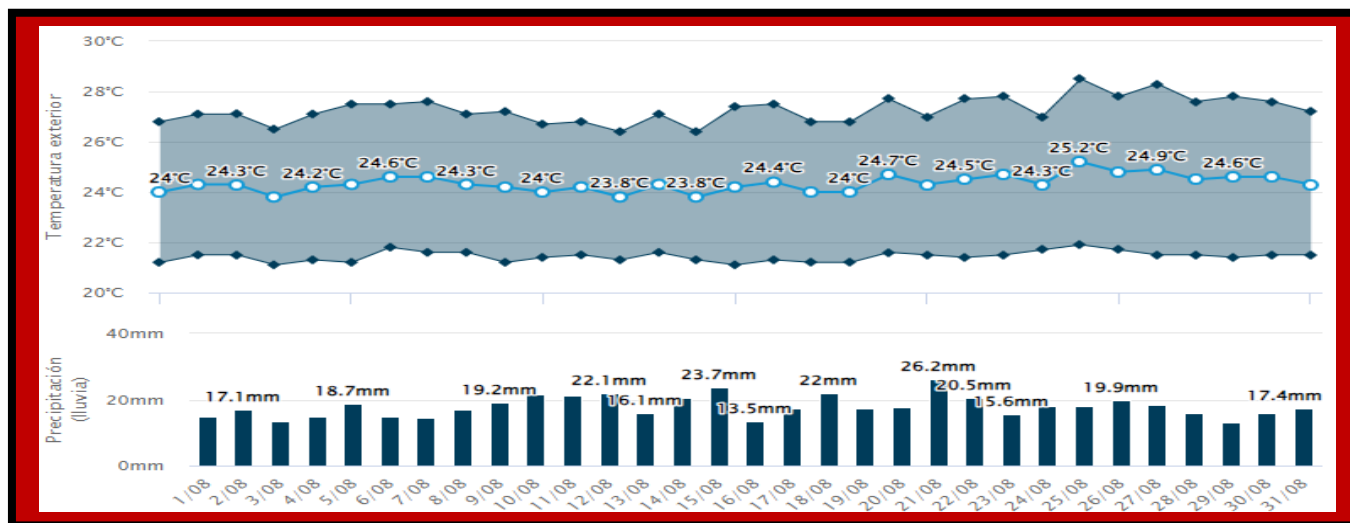
It is considered one of the most valuable collections of modern art in Latin America, along with the Museum of Art of São Paulo, the Museum of Modern Art of São Paulo, the Museum of Modern Art of Rio de Janeiro and the Botero Museum of Bogotá. The sebucán is a popular dance from Venezuela that is danced with each person having a ribbon in hand, said ribbon tied to the top of a stick. The participants braid the ribbons around the stick. The dance comes from Europe (such as the Provençal dance of the cords) and African music had an influence on the rhythm.

The name of the dance comes from the tool called sebucán than the indigenous peoples of Venezuela and other regions of the Caribbean. The tool looks like a long braided basket. The dance steps follow the same techniques used to weave the strands to make the sebucán. Once they have braided the ribbons on the stick, they can already see the resemblance to a real sebucán.



## CLIMATE CONDITIONS

The weather in August in Caracas is humid (with 558mm of precipitation in 26 days). The weather is quite pleasant in this place this month. Temperatures rise up to 28°C. The minimum is 22°C. So, the average temperature in August in Caracas is 25°C. In this month of August, the length of the day in Caracas is generally 12:28. Sunrise occurs at 06:17 and sunset is at 18:45.

### THE GUACAMAYA “WARAIRA”

#### LET'S MEET WARAIRA!

Represented by a Blue/Yellow Macaw (Ara Ararauna), it is a very representative species of the Valleys of the City of Caracas, this city exalts the name of the tribe who lived these lands since ancient times and it is currently the capital of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela and birthplace of the Liberator Simon Bolivar.

For the original native tribes of Venezuela, the Macaw has represented values such as beauty, freedom, strength, spiritual protection and connection with nature, forming an important part of their rich cultural and spiritual tradition.



These majestic birds cover the entire extension of the Venezuelan territory, there are several species: Flag Macaw (Ara macao), Red Macaw (Ara chloropterus), Maracana Macaw (Ara severus), Military Macaw (Ara militaris) and the famous Blue and Yellow Macaw (Ara Ararauna) represented by our mascot "Waraira". The macaw extends its domain throughout the Waraira Repano National Park, hence its name, a place located between the Capital District and the States of La Guaira and Miranda.

Valued for their role in the transmission of ancestral knowledge and the preservation of traditions, the macaws have been a symbol of power and status among some indigenous tribes of Venezuela. The Macaw has been much more than a simple bird for our ancient parents; they have been a symbol of power, status, ancestral knowledge and spiritual connection, honored and respected throughout generations as a fundamental part of the rich Indigenous heritage of Venezuela.



## ANALYSIS OF THE FIGURE CHOSEN AS A SYMBOLIC MASCOT FOR THE 4<sup>TH</sup> WORD CADET GAMES.

The designation of a bird as the Macaw, exhibits a deep significance in the Venezuelan world, destining it to symbolize the mascot of these Games, it constitutes an act of great cultural and artistic sensitivity, and granting originality to incorporate values highly appreciated by society as far as fauna is concerned, but also loaded with historical emotionality. For the indigenous populations, the Macaw was associated with ancestral knowledge and spirituality. It is important to appreciate that the beauty of this bird collects a natural treasure of life in our rainforests.

The design consists of an allegory of the cadet, whose body fuses features of the Macaw, distributed as partial plumage on both arms, part of the neck and full form in the head, which faithfully reflects the characteristics of the bird, exhibiting colors such as white, red, olive green, blue, yellow and a strong peak gold and black. The anatomy, strong and muscular, shows a right arm whose hand emits in high with the index and middle fingers the victory sign. The left hand resting on the waist as a sign of calm and confidence. It wears a two-piece sports outfit: a blue sports pants with yellow stripes representing the gold of victory and an undershirt with the colors of the National Flag with eight white stars. It also wears white sports shoes like the athlete it represents.

This design has embroidery on the chest, on its right side, the emblem of the International Military Sports Council (CISM), which is formed by a blue nucleus surrounded by five yellow semi-arches with red borders; and on its left side the emblem of the 4<sup>th</sup> World Cadet Games, represented by a torch honoring the Olympic games, with the colors of the National Flag, the shield of the CISM and on it the Liberator Simon Bolivar, Father of the land, venue of this new edition of the World Cadet Games, Venezuela.





## CUSTOMS AND IMMIGRATION

The regulations for entry to the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela are established in accordance with current legislation, with the respective considerations of an international sports commission, for which military aircraft will be allowed to enter our country to transport the delegations of the participating countries in the “IV CISM World Cadet Games 2024”.

## VISAS

To be able to enter the territory of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, any foreigner must possess a valid passport (still valid 6 months after your return to your country) and must present a travel document accepted by the customs and immigration authorities of our country, a visa (for the countries included in this event) as well as justifications regarding their conditions and duration of stay.

Delegations from countries that require a visa to enter the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela must complete "Final entry - Personal data for accreditation and visa support to visit our country" and send to the Organizing Committee with color scanned copies of the first page of valid passports of all members of the delegation in full size and in good quality before June 6, 2024.

## CUSTOMS PROCEDURES

At the request of the inter-ministerial delegation to major sporting events, airport services will be requested so that, in compliance with control obligations, all measures are taken to facilitate the passage through customs of the delegations, their goods: eased procedures, exclusive lanes. The missions will pay special attention to filling out the documents on the temporary entry of weapons, ammunition and drugs into the territory of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela.

## CURRENT HEALTH RULES AND VACCINES

Currently, no vaccination is mandatory to enter the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela. However, it is recommended to consult our nation's embassy in their respective countries to obtain information in this regard.

## PARTICIPATION, INVITATION

## PARTICIPANTS, MILITARY STATE

The CISM is, by definition, a military sports organization. Only active duty personnel as defined in CISM regulation, art.7.21 may participate in the Games World Cups of this sports organization. Every CISM Delegation, in active status, has the right to participate in the World Cadet Games. The updated list of active/inactive Member States can be obtained upon request from the CISM General Secretary.

The IV CISM World Cadet Games are open to all students who meet the above definition. During the Cadet Games, all participants must have a valid, official ID card or cadet card from their respective military educational institution (or at least a copy) or a verification form (in English) of military status with passport. Any cadet who does not present such identification or cadet form



will not be authorized to participate in said games and the Organizing Committee of the IV World Cadet Games (CADOCA), will have no obligation with respect to this individual (without food or accommodation). Accompanying persons, such as coaches, doctors, journalists or drivers, must also preferably be military personnel. However, civilian members are accepted. These civilian missions must conform to disciplinary standards accepted by all other participants. By signing the Final Entry, the Head of Delegation confirms the active military status of the participating athletes. If there are last minute changes in the participation of the cadets, the verification file may be signed by the Head of Mission (COM), but must be confirmed by the Sports Committee (COD) of their country by official letter.

## AGE LIMIT

Following the basic principle of the CISM, of universality of its Military Games and the decision of its Board of Directors, CISM, has established the age categories of 17 to 26, as lower and upper limits. There is absolutely no discrimination based on sex, religion, race or political origin. Maximum participation of female teams is recommended. All competitors must meet the following conditions:

- ✓ Be a citizen by nature of the country you represent.
- ✓ Have reached or are at the **age of 17 years** and no more than **26 years old by the year 2024. (Only those cadets born on a date from 01/01/98 to 12/31/07 will have the right to participate).**

## MISSION COMPOSITION

The teams sent by their nations to participate in the games are called “Mission”. Any mission can participate in all different sports or only some of them.

Therefore, the composition of the mission is directly related to the choice of the sport in which the mission will participate. The following table lists the different members of the mission per sport and represent the maximum composition of a mission.

No additional members can be included in the mission without special authorization from the Organizing Country. In all cases where the composition is not respected, the mission must pay the additional cost of accommodation (300 USD per day per person).

The missions that will participate in the IV CISM World Cadet Games will be composed of Mission Officers, VVIP's, CISM VIP's, Journalists (Military Media) and Competitors. For any questions and/or clarifications, please contact the Games Organizing Committee (CADO).



## MISSION OFFICIALS

The main actors of the CISM World Cadet Games are the athletes. To avoid missions with more officials than athletes, the following proportion must be respected by the participants:

**NOTE: Any exception must be discussed and authorized by the Games Organizing Committee (CADOC).**

## CHIEF OF MISSION

Each participating country will designate a Chief of Mission who will have the right to represent their country. A Chief of Delegation attending the Games must be the Chief of Mission, (Only exception allowed: members of the Board of Directors + representatives of the organizing committee for the different sports disciplines).

## DEPUTY CHIEF OF MISSION

When the size of the Mission exceeds 30 people, each country may designate a Deputy Head of Mission, according to the following table:

## REFEREES AND JUDGES

Any mission that attends the volleyball competition must bring two (02) international referees (01 for the men's competition and 01 for the women's competition), in the same way for the fencing sports discipline, the delegations must bring three (03) international referees. In the event that a mission cannot bring the aforementioned referees with its mission, a written request must be sent to the organizer along with the two (02) Preliminary Participation Agreements. In such case, the Organizing Committee may provide the required referees. This instance will kindly request the referees to bring their current standard uniform received from the International Volleyball Federation (if applicable), to standardize the uniforms and also use the official ones determined by the FIVB.

For some sports (for example, Shooting, Orienteering and Military Pentathlon), the Organizing Committee together with the President of the CISM Sports Committee (PCSC), will determine which countries will be asked to send International referees if required.

## SPORTS OFFICIALS

For complete details on the sports official belonging to each sport, please refer to "Handbook II" - Sports Information.

## MISSION DOCTOR

- ✓ One for mission.
- ✓ Missions can bring more doctors or physicians than those provided for in the mission composition of each sport, as long as they respect the table of proportions.

## DRIVER OR AD LIBITUM

See mission composition.

## JOURNALISTS (MILITARY MEDIA)

Each country has the right to come to the Games with three (03) military journalists (military media), as part of its mission. They will receive accreditation through the Organizing Committee (CADO). The company selected to be the CISM partner, for the television, radio broadcasting and correct distribution (host station), must be informed if military media come with cameras.



The Organizing Committee will give you a specific document explaining that your images can only be used for internal needs and cannot be distributed to your local press and media since the selected company is responsible for selling and distributing images to media around the world.

**NOTE: All other people, such as spectators, family, friends and others, are welcome to the Games and can obtain tickets to the ceremonies and sporting events. They have to organize their own food, accommodation and local transportation.**

## MODIFICATION OF THE COMPOSITION

Some flexibility should be applied in such cases. Good communication between the Organizing Committee and the participating missions is essential to resolve any misunderstanding.

**Before June 15, 2024** for any modification in the mission composition (officers, VVIP, CISM VIPS, Officers or competitors) the use of email registration is highly recommended.

**After June 15, 2024 and before July 15, 2024.** Any modification in the composition of the mission (officials, VVIP, CISM VIP, sports officials or competitors) will be made through the use of a Late Replacement Form (LRF). This form is part of the invitation file. It can be downloaded from the website, completed and mailed to the Organizing Committee. **Outside of this date no modification will be received.**

## WITHDRAWAL OF THE ENTIRE MISSION

Each nation would have to pay a fine to be set by the Board of Directors at its meeting. Any nation that does not inform the Organizing Committee of its withdrawal, in addition to the administrative cost, will also have to pay another fine, the amount of which will be determined by the Board of Directors at its meeting.

## WITHDRAWAL OF A PART OF THE MISSION

The withdrawal will be as planned according to the competition calendar, with the last departure date set for August 24 or 25, 2024 depending on the date and conditions of the return flight. If a mission does not bring an athlete or team (collective sports) previously registered in the final entry, it must pay a per capita penalty charge that will be set by the Board of Directors at its meeting, according to the proposal of the Organizing Committee. Any payment will be made to the aforementioned committee, upon arrival and registration in the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela. Any mission that refuses to pay the penalty will not be able to participate in all events.



## TRAVELLING

As a general rule, the travel expenses of the participating authorities and missions to the headquarters of the IV CISM World Cadet Games are borne by the delegations to which they belong. Local transportation will be organized by the Organizing Committee.

## ARRIVAL GENERAL

As a general rule, missions are required to strictly comply with the scheduled arrival dates set in the General Program of Events of the "MANUAL II - Sports Information". If your mission arrives divided into several groups, you will need to specify the different flights.

## EARLY ARRIVAL OF AN EXPECTED MISSION

Expenses incurred before August 16 and after August 24, 2024, will be borne by the respective missions. Taking as a reference the punctuality in terms of dates established for the start of the Games, the Organizing Committee will not accept missions outside this date, only under the condition indicated above, and must pay the additional costs of accommodation at the rate of 300 USD per day per person to the Committee Organizer upon arrival. In the event that the mission is unable to pay these accommodation costs, it will not be permitted to participate in the Games.

## LATE ARRIVAL OF AN EXPECTED MISSION

Before the start of the competitions, the expected missions will have normal participation. During the preliminary meeting, athletes and teams are placed by lot following the same procedure as the Nations present. After the start of the competitions, the expected missions will be able to compete following the planned program. The drawing of lots for upcoming events will not be repeated. The teams and individuals of the corresponding missions will be placed, at the convenience of the Technical Jury, in those positions will not affect the drawing of lots. For individuals: all events not participated in are lost.

## ARRIVAL OF AN UNEXPECTED MISSION

The CADOC will not accept the participation of these missions. The missions not sending the Final Entry till the deadline must request their participation to the CADOC before arriving in Venezuela.

If the CADOC authorizes the participation and the mission arrives after the Preliminary Meeting on no account should the events in progress or those already completed be repeated.



Participation in events not yet started is accepted. The planned program is applicable. The drawing of lots of the coming events will not be repeated. Teams and individuals of the missions concerned are placed, at the convenience of the Technical Jury, in those positions that will not affect the drawing of lots.

## GENERAL DEPARTURE

As a general rule, missions must strictly adhere to the scheduled departure dates set in the invitation. If your mission is divided into several groups, specify the different flights.

## EARLY DEPARTURE

No sanctions will be applied if an athlete or a mission leaves the Games with the approval of the CISM, due to absolute necessity or in case of emergency (for example, injuries, flight connection problems, death of a family member, among others.).

## LATE DEPARTURE

In all cases, missions that depart after the set date must pay additional accommodation costs at a rate of **300 USD** per day per person. For any questions and/or clarifications, please contact the Organizing Committee.

**If missions need to be extended due to flight schedule issue, please inform on the Final Registration Form.**

## STAY RULES & STAY PROGRAM

Upon arrival in the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, participants will receive an Information Package (Welcome Package/Guide) containing the complete stay program. The following information will be especially detailed:

General calendar - Detailed calendar and schedule of all competitions (minute by minute schedule).

- ✓ Place and date of the Opening and Closing Ceremony.
- ✓ Place and date of the different meetings.
- ✓ Place and date of official receptions. Dress standards for different occasions. Safety matters.
- ✓ Appropriate maps of the different locations.
- ✓ Information and tourism guides (information about the city and its surroundings).



## DISCIPLINARY MATTER

The Chefs of Mission in the Games are responsible for the conduct of their mission. The missions fall under the jurisdiction of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela. During the Games, all athletes present in the competition areas are equal before the jury, the referees and themselves.

No one can use their ranks to impose their opinion on sports matters. Civilian members of missions must conform to disciplinary standards accepted by all other participants.

## DRESS CODE (MILITARY UNIFORM)

All cadets must wear the National Military Academy (summer) uniform during official ceremonies, such as the Opening Ceremony. Cadets without the appropriate uniform will not be able to participate in the Games.

The awarding of medals can be done in a sports uniform, if for organizational reasons it is not possible to use a military uniform, for example, when the awarding immediately follows a competitive sporting event. But, whenever possible, the medal ceremony will be held in uniform to enhance the military character of the Games.

## NATIONAL SPORTS SUIT

It is recommended that competitors have at least one official training uniform and one official competition uniform, highlighting the national colors with the name of the country, official shorts, socks and sports shoes. Caps are not mandatory.

## CIVILIAN DRESS

Civil clothing may be used in cultural activities organized by the Organizing Committee, as well as in free time between competitions and ceremonies.

## ADVERTISING

All advertising during sports competitions and the awarding of medals in the competition areas and at the accommodation sites must be in accordance with the regulations of the relevant International Federation and the rules of the CISM.

- ✓ Any type of advertising that goes against ethics, or the spirit of sport and CISM is strictly prohibited.
- ✓ Any violation of this rule will automatically result in the immediate disqualification of the athlete/team.



- ✓ As a general rule at CISM, any political, tobacco and/or alcohol advertising is strictly prohibited.

## PROHIBITED ACTIONS

In accordance with the statutes and traditions of the CISM, any political or religious action during the Games, in particular the dissemination of propaganda documents, images, brochures, reviews, etc., is strictly prohibited.

Any contravention will result in the exclusion of the mission from the competition and the case will be referred to the CISM Disciplinary Commission.

## FOOD AND ACCOMMODATION

### CATEGORIES CONSIDERED FOR ACCOMMODATION

The Organizing Committee undertakes to accommodate on a full board and accommodation basis any officially registered participant in the IV CISM World Cadet Games.

This accommodation will respect the following table:

**If the mission is not housed in the official location determined by the Organizing Committee, they will not have logistical and transportation support and it is even likely that there will be security difficulties.**

## FOOD AND DRINKS

Meals and drinks will be balanced and substantial and will meet the requirements of sports diet. To the extent possible, the following points will be taken into account:

- ✓ Particular traditions of race and religion
- ✓ Medical requirements and prescriptions
- ✓ Event schedule
- ✓ The Organizing Committee will provide non-alcoholic beverages, meals and water free of charge throughout the duration of the competitions.

## EXTRA EXPENSES

Additional expenses including telephone, laundry and beverages must be paid by consumers. Any expenses before the scheduled arrival and/or departure date must be covered by the participants.



## TRANSPORT TRAVEL EXPENSES

As a general rule, the travel expenses of the participating authorities and missions to the headquarters of the IV CISM World Cadet Games are borne by the members of the delegations to which they belong. Only in those cases where solidarity flight air support is requested and it is duly argued before the CISM Coordination Committee, the corresponding study can be carried out in order to be officially communicated to the Organizing Committee of such request for activation, if applicable of a solidarity flight as stipulated in section (F) of the following points to be discussed. The Local transportation is mandatory from all accommodation sites to all sports competitions and official venues; These costs will be assumed by the Organizing Committee, which will prepare a transportation plan for the Games, taking into account the following points:

- a. There will be an individual car service with driver and link with the Organizing Committee, provided for officials or liaison officials for each of the following authorities
  - ✓ President of CISM
  - ✓ CISM Vice Presidents
  - ✓ CISM Official Representatives (OCRs)
  - ✓ Secretary General of CISM
  - ✓ CISM Games Director
  - ✓ President of the CISM Sports Committee (PCSC).
- b. A special transportation service will be available to transport the members of the CISM Board of Directors, Heads of Mission, CISM Headquarters Staff, Sports Committee Members (CSC), from their hotels to the sports facilities and vice versa.
- c. A transportation service will be available to transport participants:
  - ✓ From the Simón Bolívar International Airport of Maiquetia to the accommodation sites and vice versa.
  - ✓ From accommodation sites to sports facilities and vice versa.
- d. Special vehicles with drivers will be made available for each President of the CISM Sports Committee (PCSC) and its members. Transportation to and from the venue will be available as much time as possible prior to the arrival and departure of the athletes and will be considered as part of the transportation plan.
- e. The Organizing Committee: Will ensure that drivers are properly trained as such and have satisfactory knowledge of local geography. In cases where dedicated cars will be used for extended periods, the CADOC must consider the use of more than one driver shift per car.





- f. The organization of the IV World Cadets Games through the Government of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, as host, will guarantee the transfer to those countries that, through the Coordination Committee, formally request the CISM, for which this only means of transportation will be established. formal communication with the organizing committee to protocolize air support through a solidarity flight.

## HEALTH CARE AND INSURANCE MEDICAL ATTENTION

Medical centers will be established at the athlete's accommodation to treat minor cases. Severe cases will be treated at a full-service hospital. The first aid and evacuation service will be available in the sports facilities and athletes' accommodation.

The Organizing Committee will cover all necessary expenses for emergency care (first aid) at the hospital and/or medical center.

All other expenses such as hospitalization, surgical operations and any other special treatment, repatriation in case of illness due to illness or accident, other illness/accident expenses such as compensation for loss of income or non-emergency medical/dental care will be charge of the user himself.

If for any reason the injured athlete's delegation rejects the medical arrangements proposed by the Organizing Committee, the costs of hospitalization or treatment at other facilities will be the responsibility of the delegation. If the mission brings any medication to treat its team and staff, it must declare it through the "Medicine Declaration Form" that is attached to the Final Entry forms.

The Organizing Committee will not be responsible for any claim for losses, injuries or damages arising from the celebration of the Games.

Points related to medical coverage:

- ✓ The Organizing Committee guarantees the first aid and non-invasive sports medicine service.
- ✓ The Organizing Committee guarantees medical follow-up after injuries and possible medical or psychological consequences resulting from the injury.
- ✓ The Missions must have adequate insurance to cover travel, accidents and health risks since they are not under the responsibility of the CADOC or the CISM.



## SECURITY AND ACCREDITATION

### GENERAL ASPECT

The Organizing Committee, through its Security and Intelligence Directorate, is responsible for the security of all authorities, missions and guests during the competitions, official transportation and at authorized stay accommodation sites.

### SECURITY POLICIES

All participating delegations and national staff will be registered and will receive the corresponding credentials to access sports facilities, accommodations and all the sites they require. The use of accreditation will provide the necessary control and security measures that ensure the smooth flow of personnel while restricting access by unauthorized persons, providing a safe environment for all.

Delegations must complete their Final Entry corresponding to personal data for accreditation and visa support to visit the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela and send the Organizing Committee color photographs in good quality (35mm\*45mm minimum size in JPG format, with a resolution not lower than at 300dpi) of all members of the delegation before **June 15, 2024**.

## ENTERTAINMENT AND CULTURAL DAY

Guided tours of the host city will be planned for participants. The tours will take participants through the most important tourist places in the city of Caracas.

## CISM MEETING POINT - CISM CLUB

As one of the main objectives of the CISM is to promote relations between military athletes of all nations, the Organizing Committee will make available in each of the athletes' accommodations a place where they can meet and exchange information, which includes:

- ✓ Information center (transport, banking facilities, entertainment, guided tours, among others).
- ✓ Post office.
- ✓ Newstand (photos, magazines, etc.).
- ✓ CISM information notice board.
- ✓ Supports for program and distribution of results.



- ✓ Convenience store.
- ✓ Lounge bar with TV.
- ✓ Public Telephones.
- ✓ Games room.
- ✓ LAN House with Internet Points.
- ✓ Display of prizes and souvenirs related to the competitions.

## COMMAND AND CONTROL

The Command and Control Office will provide the Information Technology (IT) and Communications facilities to conduct and coordinate the Games. The Organizing Committee will provide an Internet website that will guarantee and allow dissemination. Adequate collection of relevant data before and during the Games. The dissemination of the results will also be part of this site.

## CEREMONIES AND PROTOCOL

### MILITARY CHARACTER

All events will have a military character and will include ceremonies that enhance their prestige. The following rules and recommendations support this purpose and the Organizing Committee will respect them and use them as an operational base, with all due respect to the protocol and military traditions of their nation.

### OPENING AND CLOSING CEREMONIES

For the Opening Ceremony, the missions in their national military uniforms, led by the captains of their teams and the flag bearers, enter the Patio of Honor of the Bolivarian Military University of Venezuela and gather according to French alphabetical order. The host nation team is the last to enter the Quad. The flags of the participating nations will already be raised in the same order, after the entry of the missions, the flag of the Host Country is raised, simultaneously sounding the notes of the National Anthem and subsequently the flag of the CISM is raised, with its respective Anthem. The CISM flame is lit. The ceremony program will be the responsibility of the Organizing Committee and will be presented for approval to the CISM. An opening show will be held that will demonstrate the cultural, human and sporting heritage of the host nation.

The President of CISM and a dignitary from the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela will give a welcome speech. The Closing Ceremony of the Games is carried out in the same practical manner as the Opening Ceremony. For the Closing Ceremony the missions in their national military uniforms.



## **DIPLOMATIC REPRESENTATIVES**

To give CISM events a more official character and foster friendly relations between the governments of member countries, members representing the Ministry of Defense and diplomatic representatives of all participating nations are invited to the Games.

## **SUPPORT FOR THE PRESS AND MEDIA**

The Organizing Committee will provide an efficient and quality infrastructure for all accredited press that will work before, during and after the Games. All sports venues will have special areas and exclusive services for journalists (written press, radio, television and photographers). An international signal will be available to transmit the image of the Games. The Organizing Committee will offer an International Broadcasting Center and Press Center located near the competition venues, with easy access and facilities for all accredited press.

## **PRESS**

Accredited journalists will have free internet access in all press areas of the Games. Photographers will also have a special service with strategic positions for taking photographs on all playing fields and their respective work room.

## **MEDIA SUPPORT**

The radio and television announcers who will broadcast the Games will also have a service dedicated to their professionals. Accredited journalists will also have access to all official information through the Official Website, and during the Games will provide a daily summary with the main images of the day.

## GENERAL CONDITIONS

The sporting events of the IV CISM World Cadet Games will be organized in accordance with the most recent CISM sporting regulations (July 2021 version) and the technical rules of the corresponding International Sports Federation, unless otherwise indicated. contrary. The composition of a mission explained in the following pages is considered the maximum. For more information on the composition of the mission, see Manual I.

## SPORTS AUTHORITIES

The authorities by sport are:

- ✓ CISM Official Representatives (OCRs)
- ✓ The President of the CISM Sports Committee (PCSC)
- ✓ The General Manager of Sports (GSM)
- ✓ The Technical Jury (JT)
- ✓ The Jury of Appeal (JA)

## THE OFFICIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF CISM (OCRs)

**There will be seven (7) OCR's, one for each sports.**

For all these sports organized in the IV CISM World Cadet Games, CISM BoD will designate the CISM Official Representative among the four (04) continental presidents and/or members of the Board. However, the Board of Directors may designate another delegate or CISM HQ Staff to officially represent CISM. The Official Representation cannot act as Chief of Mission at the same time.

Each Official Representative will be technically assisted by the Presidents of the corresponding CISM Sports Committee.

The Secretary General officially notifies the designated representatives and the Organizing Committee of the designation of these seven (07) Official Representatives for the Games.

The Organizing Committee will officially invite the Official Representatives at least 4 months before the Games. The Official CISM Representatives must send a letter to the Organizing Committee (with a copy to the Secretary General) to confirm their participation. If the designated Official Representative, at the last moment, is unable to attend the Games or fulfill his/her mission, he/she must notify the Organizing Committee and the Secretary General, so that alternative measures can be taken.

## THE PRESIDENT OF THE CISM SPORTS COMMITTEE (PCSC)

The CISM has a Sports Committee that is responsible for the general technical aspects of each sport of the IV World Cadet Games.

During the Games, the role played by the CISM Sports Committee (CSC) and its President is of utmost importance.



For details on the exact functions and roles played by the CSC and PCSC, please refer to the CISM Regulations, art. 2.15,16.

## **THE GENERAL SPORTS MANAGER (GSM) AND THE VENUE MANAGERS (MV)**

The Organizing Committee has appointed the citizen General Division Yvan José Bello Rojas, President of the Sports Federation of the Bolivarian National Armed Force (fedofaven@gmail.com) as General Manager of Sports, responsible for all sporting events during the Cadet Games. For each sports venue of the IV CISM World Cadet Games, the Organizing Committee will appoint the Venue Managers. The President of the Sports Committee and the General Sports Manager will be responsible for the general technical aspects of all the disciplines of the World Cadet Games. Venue Managers will be in charge of all technical, organizational and administrative matters for that sport/discipline/venue.

## **THE TECHNICAL JURY (JT)**

For each sport scheduled during the Games, a Technical Jury will be established. For details on the exact functions and roles performed by the JT, please refer to the CISM General Regulations, Art. 8.12.

## **THE JURY OF APPEAL (JA)**

For each sport scheduled during the Games, an Appeal Jury will be established. For details on the exact functions and roles performed by the JA, please refer to the CISM General Regulations, Art. 8.13.

## **OFFICIAL MEETINGS**

The various official meetings held during the Cadet Games are essential for good organization and are largely responsible for the smooth running of the Games. They are the following:

- ✓ Preliminary and Technical Meetings.
- ✓ Technical Jury Meetings.
- ✓ Meetings of the Jury of Appeal.

**All aspects of these meetings are described in the CISM General Regulations, art. 8.28.**

## **RECORDS**

All aspects of the CISM World Records are described in the CISM General Regulations, art. 8.36.

## **AWARDS**

All information regarding the criteria for the attribution of official medals per event at the Games will be available at the IV CISM World Cadet Games and are described in the CISM General Regulations. Prizes will be awarded at the end of each competition, at which time the





winners will be greeted with the national anthem, while the national flags of the medal winners are raised.

## PROTESTS

The procedures for handling any protests related to competition matters are described in the CISM Regulations, **Art. 8.13-letter F**.

## DOPING TESTS

Doping tests will not be carried. However, anti-doping education will be conducted according to WADA and CISM Anti-Doping Handbook will b

## EDUCATION CONCEPT

Workshops, seminars, forums aiming at exchanging military training concepts, to inspire or get inspired by the programs of other military academies, to acquire valuable theories that will be used for future commitment in order to make the cadets become better cadets, better soldiers and better military leaders, will be arranged accordingly.

- ✓ For all those cases not specified in the regulations cited above, the authorities have the power to decide in accordance with the guidelines and spirit of the CISM.

- ✓ The testing schedule varies depending on the number of countries that participate. The dissemination of the schedule must be disseminated through the RT and confirmed the day before each test.
- ✓ You may organize a day of visits or other cultural activities during WMCG provided that these activities do not overlap with the general testing schedule.



- ✓ If the number of participants allows it, each event will be developed in such a way that all fencers compete against all fencers from different nations (CISM round-robin format). Should there be a high number of participants, the format of the competition may be modified.

## 7.4 CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM

Five classifications will be established based on the results:

- a. Classification by nation, taking into account the results of the three fencers per country, even if one is absent;
- b. Individual classification, to include all participants in the competition, taking into account the results of the matches actually played;
- c. Classification by nation according to the set of weapons of male competitors;
- d. Classification by nation according to the set of weapons of female competitors;
- e. Classification by nation according to the set of all weapons.
- f. The regulations used to establish these degrees are included in Art. 13 of the Specific Regulations.
